#### FROM THE LIBRARY DIRECTOR

## CECI MARLOW

Spring = New Beginnings and we are excited to announce a new beginning for your public library and you!

Hartland's Cromaine joined the TLN Shared Catalog in November 2015. Despite a few hiccups, we believe that you are being served even more effectively by having the resources of all of the Shared Catalog

member libraries and their collections on call to meet your requests and information needs.

We knew that TLN had already begun to consider moving from the current background software, what the industry calls "Integrated Library System" or ILS, that permits 50-some libraries to share collections as if they were all in one giant building. We had sent staff to what we call "vendor demos" to test other ILS and determine which one might be a good candidate to pursue. It is a very dynamic industry and, like many in the technology field, mergers and buy-outs happen. As in any business, sometimes when one company buys another, it turns out great for all. Sometimes, not so good. We joined the TLN Shared Catalog knowing another change might be in the near future.

End result of the preliminary investigation was that, yes, TLN wanted to look at finding and negotiating the move to another ILS. That has now been underway since last summer, including the process of moving (migrating) millions of data records into the new ILS which is called CARL. Unlike our current ILS, the new CARL system is being developed with TLN and is known for its successful user interface. Jim Pletz, Director of TLN said this when announcing the purchase, "Their focus on the CARL-ConnectDiscovery online catalog and their commitment to enhancing the user experience will benefit our patrons and staff in exciting new ways."

Hartland's Cromaine, as part of the TLN Shared Catalog, will adopt the new ILS this spring. Our staff and our patrons are the newest members of the TLN Shared Catalog and have the most recent migration experience. To help TLN with this migration, our staff has been called upon to share our overall positive experience, our in-house training guides, and our communications. We are excited about this much better ILS and the many opportunities being given to TLN to tailor the user experience to you.

Because MeLCat, the statewide catalog, requires even more time to allow for the migration of TLN's records, there will be no MeLCat searching, borrowing, or holds possible from April 1 through June 1. All MeLCat materials must be returned by April 1.

Friday, May 25 at 6:00 pm, the current TLN Shared Catalog will close down.

**The TLN Shared Catalog, Enterprise Catalog, will be offline - no searching, no holds, no renewals - throughout the Memorial Day weekend. Cromaine is also closed during that period although our material returns will be open, as well as wireless in the parking lots and other virtual services.**

**Tuesday, May 28 at 9:00 am, the new TLN Shared Catalog with the new CARL ConnectDiscovery catalog will be open for business.**

We will offer lots of hands-on opportunities for you to learn the new catalog, once we have our training down pat. We truly are convinced this will be a more intuitive to use catalog and that you will find little training is needed. As always, please let me know your thoughts and what more will improve your experience at Hartland's Cromaine. We're here to serve you!

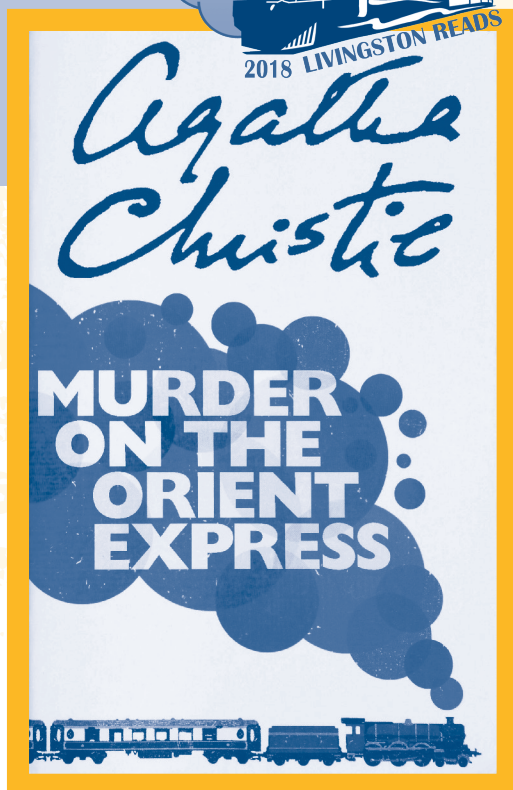
