From the Library Director, Ceci Marlow



The Cromaine Reconfiguration & Renovation Project is moving forward. It is most likely that soil erosion fencing (the orange barrier on wooden stakes) will have gone up in mid-August as well as construction fencing. Site work begins and construction is on its way!

The official groundbreaking will be held Thursday, September 8, at 9:00 am. ALL are invited! This is likely the last time that Cromaine in the Village will see its shape altered in its history. This is only the third addition of space since its first cornerstone was laid March 26, 1927. For a community that

has grown so hugely in these nearly 90 years, the building has served well and will continue to do so as a community center for another 90 years.

Residents have asked how the addition of space is possible after three failed bond proposals. Briefly: 1) The library's savings have been building, waiting for the right time to do a full infrastructure overhaul. 2) Then the savings for the replacement of HVAC systems and much more were enhanced in recent years by some very strategic cost-cutting, including reductions in benefits for full-time staff, staffing reductions through attrition only (no lay-offs), and a lot of careful management of resources, from limiting office supplies to pursuing discounts in every possible area (mostly through many more collaborative purchasing agreements). 3) This project is much much smaller than any of those proposed for bond--a construction cost of \$1.9 million that will provide new HVAC and full fire suppression throughout all parts of the building, plus only the space that is equal to the size of Crossroads which will close in 2017.


